I miss being in worship together. We hear the same thing from many of you. We have all been through a lot this past year. We have been running a long race. We have seen new COVID cases rise and now we are seeing them decline to the levels they were in April last year. There are vaccines becoming available and things are looking up. Optimists are looking at an end time when we can get back to some kind of normal. We have reason to be hopeful. But, we're not done yet. The race is not over. We need to finish the race. We have at least one more lap to go.

As we wait to get back inside safely, we will be able to take advantage of our space outdoors using our FM broadcast and as the lawn dries up, we can bring out lawn chairs to worship on the lawn. It's a step toward what we are used to, but there is still at least one lap left.

Navigating this time has brought all sorts of challenges. I am grateful for the ways we all bear with it and your patience as we accommodate, figure out ways to work with limited internet upload speeds, learn new technology, and get new equipment.

We have also learned a great deal this past year. We learned that some people really like the option of connecting online when we are not able to be present. Even after the doors open again, we intend to keep up a strong online presence. We have also learned how important it is to be gathered around our mission; Gathered in Christ, Fed by God's Word and Sent to Serve. Even when we have not been able to gather for in person worship we continue to adapt how we serve with our partner ministries; food, formula, diapers, clothes and so much more dropped off in our east entrance, transitioning a sit down meal at Bread of Healing at Cross Lutheran to a drive through chili meal, doing meetings, study and worship online. This tells us that while the building is closed our church is open and alive.

I can't wait to see you in just a few more weeks! While we

wait pray, for your church, our leaders and staff, our bishop, and our nation as we travel through these unimaginable times together.

n-Person Lectors & Ushers Needed



TACOS Families,

First, I would like to express my deepest thanks for your patience and grace during these trying times of the past year. Your continued support of the TACOS ministry is what keeps this program alive, eagerly awaiting the opportunity to jump back into everything we have missed out on this past year.

When looking anywhere today, it is easy to see that we are reaching a point in our journey through this global pandemic that is bringing much frustration and fatigue. You and your families have likely faced some of the most difficult times and continue to struggle with events related and unrelated to our pandemic culture. Eagerness to seek opportunities to latch onto any sense of normalcy are at all-time highs. Let me be very clear in saying that I see you, I feel for you, and I understand your desires. Every week we continue to reach out using only virtual means strains on me as well, as I know how ineffective these methods can feel when compared to what the TACOS concept is meant to be. I desire to come back to my normal work just as much as any of our TACOS do too.

I also understand how we are constantly learning more about the virus and how to combat its spread in communities like schools and after-school programs. Even organizations like the CDC have released guidelines suggesting ways in which schools could safely reopen. I understand the path of logic then leading to questions of why we cannot resume regular TACOS programming with said guidelines.



In truth, the infrastructure and resources provided in the TA-COS program do not meet the extensiveness of the multiple mitigation strategies that would be necessary to return. Although many safety measures would be easy to implement, such as physical distancing and masking, we do not have the ability to, for example, regularly test leadership and participants, which is strongly encouraged for any kind of reopening. It is a truth that is not easily swallowed but is the reality of our situation. With careful consideration and discernment, we still believe it is in our best interest to remain virtual. This again is not a decision made lightly and one that is guided by both the church council and staff of COS and careful examination of guidelines suggested by the CDC and Wisconsin Council of Churches.

We will continue to be active on our virtual platform at //tacosoutreach.com/virtualmode and on our social media pages. We also understand that with the arrival of the spring season comes the opportunity to organize events outside. This is an option we are very open to exploring and hope to implement some dates to gather safely outdoors, as well as having service project opportunities as early as the end of March. Please continue to be vigilant of our communications in planning spring outdoor events and service projects.

With that being said, I would like to focus on the optimistic and hopeful future that becomes clearer every day! Friends, the reality is we have a vaccine, COVID numbers continue to decline, containment seems to be in reach. We are well on our way to having a world where our first thought does not have to be about a deadly disease. We just need to finish the race. We have come too far and worked too hard to have our work be blighted. I strongly encourage you to take every precaution in fighting this virus. Wash your hands regularly with soap and water, wear a mask or two in public, continue to physically distance from others, and get vaccinated when you are able. There is one way to get back to our normal world, and that is by doing the few things we can do to control the spread of this virus and put it to rest.

Please be respectful of our decision to remain virtual and continue to be hopeful that we may soon again see each other when the proper time warrants a safe return. Wednesday, March 10th


