# Fom the Pastor

One of the podcasts I listen to recently featured Yale philosopher and cognitive scientist, L. A. Paul posing the question, "Do You Want To Become a Vampire?" She used this thought experiment as a way of illuminating the challenges with how we make choices about transformational experiences, when we don't know how the experience will change us. When faced with such choices, do we prioritize our preferences now? Or the preferences we imagine we will have after being transformed? I found the whole conversation riveting.

As Christians, we often talk about how God transforms us through the work of the gospel. Though God loves us and welcomes us as we are, we give voice to how following Christ should align our hearts with the heart of God – transforming our preferences to more closely match the preferences we hear Jesus proclaim in the gospels. In following Jesus, we believe that we will begin to more consistently find ourselves drawn to the work of justice; to the offering of forgiveness; to the ways of compassion and care for those in need.

While I listened to L.A. Paul frame this question of how we weigh the preferences of our current selves or our imagined future selves, I realized that my Christian faith makes the question for me a simpler one – whatever the hypothetical transformative experience, I should make the choice that seems most likely to continue the transformative work of the Holy Spirit within me. Granted, whether or not I *actually* make that choice is another matter #SinnerAndSaint.

May you, dear reader, experience the transformative power of the Holy Spirit at work within you. May you embrace the choices that align you with Christ's way of justice and compassion, and may you know that even when we choose differently, there is grace for that.

# **Covid-19 Ministry Plan**

In light of increases in cases of Covid-19 for our community, our council has agreed to the following plan to guide our worship practices and building use moving forward. Our benchmarks are based on following the numbers of new cases per 100k population over a seven day average for Waukesha county, as reported by the Brown School of Public Health's website www.globalepidemics.org.

Following the example of our CCOS neighbors at Redeemer UCC, movement between the tiers will require a 14 consecutive day favorable trend prior to moving to a less restrictive level, and a 4 consecutive day unfavorable trend will be grounds to move to a more restrictive level.

For more information about Covid-19 and ministry practices in Wisconsin, the Greater Milwaukee Synod has encouraged its members to look to the Wisconsin Council of Churches, as this organization has been diligently cataloguing informational resources and grounding them within the understanding of the Christian faith since the early days of the pandemic. Their most recent returning to church supplement, By Faith We Stand Firm, was published on July 28th 2021. You can check out this, and other resources, on their website www.wichurches.org .

We all long for this season to be behind us, but we move forward trusting that God is with us in this journey. Thank you for your continued patience and grace as we continue to get creative about sustaining the work of the gospel during these strange times.

### <u>Update on Worship at COS:</u>

At an extension of the September council meeting, we created benchmarks to direct our worship time and building use. These guidelines are presented on the website and here in the newsletter. Please check out the links provided in sidebar of the plan. We will be following the numbers of new cases in Waukesha County per 100,000 over a seven-day average.

Please be sure to pay attention to the council or staff updates as they come out. Thank you for your patience and please pray for us as we continue to make decisions that impact us all.

### Adopt-a-Garden/Yard Care


Now that the growing season is coming to an end, please take a moment to prepare your garden area for winter. In addition,
