From the Pastor

Depending on when you are reading this, we have just confirmed nearly 30 of the youth in our congregation. I find it centering to experience the rhythms and rituals of our church community. Baptisms, young people being confirmed, even our All Saints celebration recalling those members in our community who have joined the church triumphant this past year - these are practices that tie our congregation to prior generations of faithful followers of Christ.

This month, we are welcoming our new Interim Pastor to the community. In a way, welcoming our Interim and confirming our youth are also events that tie us to the future generations of our congregation. Pastor Michael will walk with us as we seek God's guidance and reflect on how God is calling us to be the body of Christ. And, as these newly confirmed members of our congregation continue in their own faith journey, we trust that the Holy Spirit will also be guiding them in how the stories of their lives connect to God's ongoing story of redemption for the whole of creation.

May the God who draws all peoples across the generations to take part in the story of redemption, stir in us a curiosity for the new thing God is preparing in our midst. And may the Holy Spirit unite us in holy purpose to transform this community to reflect God's compassion and grace.

Interim Search Ends!

We have finalized our agreement with Pastor Michael Anderson to be our interim. He will be with us for the next 18-24 months. He will walk with us as we determine who we

are now as well as perform other pastoral duties and support Pastor Joe and the staff as we search for a new Lead Pastor. Pastor Michael will help us to prepare to call a new pastor. This is not a called position. The Synod, with agreement from



COS and Pastor Michael, appoints him as our interim. He is not allowed to be a candidate for our future senior pastor.

Pastor Michael will begin with us on Monday, November 8th. His first Sunday with us will be November 14th. We will have a simple reception for him on that day.

Meet COS Interim Pastor Michael Anderson!

Rev. Michael Anderson is an ELCA pastor of 16 years and has served congregations in the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod and the Greater Milwaukee Synod. Most recently he served as interim pastor at The Lutheran Church of the Living Christ in Germantown, WI. A graduate of Valparaiso University with a Bachelor of Art degree in Communication and Spanish, he earned a Master of Divinity degree from The Lutheran Theo-



logical Seminary at Philadelphia (now, United Lutheran Seminary).

A Wisconsin native, Pastor Michael has enjoyed opportunities to live and travel both domestically and internationally. His professional interests include liturgy and preaching, faith formation, cultivating spiritual practices, congregational mission and leadership development, and writing. His personal hobbies include cheering on the Milwaukee Brewers, running, golf, motorcycle road trips, growing his vinyl record collection, and reading (especially the work of Jim Harrison, Christopher Moore, N.T. Wright, and Christian Wiman). He and his wife Rebecca live in Milwaukee, WI with their dog.





ber sock drive! The socks collected will be donated to our ministry partners to warm the feet of many children and adults.




Bread of Healing Meal
