Good Tidings!

Matthew 2:1-2

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising and have come to pay him homage."

The scripture quoted above tells part of the story of the wise men following a star to find the newborn Christ child – it is the classic gospel reading for the observance of the *Epiphany of our Lord*. The word Epiphany can be defined as: manifest or manifestation. So, we might understand Epiphany as the time set aside for our honoring and contemplating the glory and mystery of God being manifest to humanity in Christ. While Jesus may have been born in ancient history, Christ still comes to us and is manifest in this life each and every day. It's really quite the gift! The presence of God revealing itself in creation all the time! May God give us eyes to see and ears to hear!

The Matthew story of the magi following the star until it led them to the baby Jesus might be good encouraging scripture for the moment in history that Christ Our Savior is walking through. Having entered a period of transition by initiating a call process to search for a new pastor, a whole lot of the work that the congregation will engage in will be the work of the discernment. That is to say, the congregation will engage in a prayerful process of learning about itself in order that it might gain greater clarity around the type of pastoral leadership it needs to move into its next season of mission. When a congregation pursues the mission of God's kingdom, invariably you are led into encounters with Christ. This isn't just good news. It's *GREAT* news.

What's *great* about this news is ultimately that it's challenging, invigorating, and faithful. Perhaps we might say that this period of learning that COS is living through is one of learning to watch for the rising of the star that will continue to lead the community in the way of Christ for the foreseeable future. To be a 21st century church is to live with many different demands on who we think we should be and what we

think we should be doing or how we are going to preserve what we've had or how we're going to become something else in the future. But one thing that remains the same is that you can never have a church engaged in any learning about itself or moving in any direction at all without being grounded by the one who illuminates and gives life to all: Jesus Christ.

In this season of learning, discernment, and transition may you be sustained by the comfort and inspiration of the Holy Spirit and grounded in the practices of our faith tradition – prayer, worship, and the sacraments - that nurture us, give us our unity, and offer us life.

One of the most awe inspiring traits of humankind is the vast range of depths we are capable of becoming. Humankind produces the likes of Harriet Tubman and Albert Einstein, but also Adolf Hitler and Jeffrey Dahmer. Humans are capable of truly awesome and awful legacies. And yet, for the vast majority of humans, our lives and our actions will never be recorded in history books. People forget that the phrase "Pull yourselves up by your own bootstraps" was originally said in jest because of the impossibility of it. Humans exist in relationship with one another, and it is through collective effort and through the support of community that the greatest accomplishments of humankind have been enacted.



But secondly, and more to the point of this article, your life and actions matter because you have been called and chosen to help bear the kingdom of heaven into the

world. Yes, you! This is what we proclaim in our common Christian faith – Christ has accomplished the salvation of humankind, but has called his followers into the work of bringing about the community of God in its fullness in our

communities. By our words and our actions, by the legacies we enact with our lives, we can advance the unfolding experience of the divine in this world. We can join with Christ's movement to care for those who are hungry or sick; we can stand for justice on behalf of those who are imprisoned or oppressed; we can work to ensure that the immigrant and the refugee are welcomed and provided for in our land, all because of the truth of creation's abundance and God's compassion for all of the family of humankind that has been revealed through Jesus.

Or, we can not. We can choose to pay no heed to the Way of Christ, and just focus on our own business and our own concerns. God gives us the power to choose – the full range of humankind's depths are possible for us. But some choices are grounded in love of neighbor. Some choices foster increased wellness and wholeness for ourselves and others. Some choices increase the justice and compassion in the world and set the stage for a better tomorrow. God invites us to choose life! To experience the abundant life found in following Christ's Way. There are folks who like to ring in the new year by setting resolutions for themselves to guide their choices for the coming year. I invite you to consider the how God is calling you into the promise and possibility of 2022, and to reflect on what legacy you will create with the choices you make. May the blessed Creator of the Cosmos watch over you and guide you in 2022.
