What is Lent for?

The season of Lent is intended to help lead us to practicing new life and freedom in God's love and light. There are a number of practices in Lent that can be helpful for us.

Sacrifice: Give up something we enjoy for the sake of those in need. This is not giving up chocolate in hopes of losing a few pounds. The best practice is a focus on how our choices affect others. Giving up chocolate for the sake of others means also setting aside the money we would have spent on chocolate and give it to help those in need – those who struggle to have a meal, not to mention chocolate. Consider taking the \$1 a day challenge for hunger seriously. Teach your children to be generous even as you practice it yourself.

Prayer and Worship: These are always good things to do, but especially now they can help center us. For most of us the scarcest commodity is time. Work, email, messages, stress, pressure, and schedules seem to invade everything. Time for worship, prayer, reflection, and meditation alone serves to get us re-centered in God's promise, God's love for us. It reminds us we are more than our schedules and commitments. Prayer and worship is for us – it helps us become renewed, refreshed and filled back up.

Acts of love: Our theme in worship this year is "Do Something", following a popular song that reflects the Christian faith. We are not emphasizing doing something in worship. Rather, this is something we take with us, it is portable. We remember Jesus calls us to believe AND action. We don't' need to take on all of the worlds' problems but we can address some of the needs we see. We may not be able to feed all the hungry people in the world, but we can feed a few. Come to a food pack at church on Wednesday evenings or Saturday, March 14th or Sunday, March 15th. In 45 minutes you will feed over 500 people. Imagine what we can do together!

These are ways we practice repentance. Repentance is about changing direction in life so we are no longer living for ourselves, but living to love others, changing direction so we are no longer running from God but running TO God. It doesn't need to be dramatic or make headlines. Most faithful acts of love don't. But as we heard in the Gospel on Ash Wednes-

day, practice your faith quietly. Living our faith is not performance art nor is our faith a spectator sport where we watch God do things. Living our faith happens in small pieces; when we forgive those who



hurt us, when we share with those in need, when we are generous with others, when we show compassion and mercy to those who suffer, when we welcome the stranger and include the outsider. None of those things are meant to be seen or even notice by anyone other than the ones who receive it.

Jesus calls us to live humbly and gently in this world, sharing God's peace and the promise of new life. Use these 40 days as a time to practice new life, to live your faith in pieces that become part of the fabric of our lives.

Tuesday, March 10th at 6:30 a.m.


Come join us for hot eggy food, strong coffee and God's Word reflection on the Gospel readings for the prior month. This group meets at 6:30 a.m.

God is Present

It's usually this time of year that many start looking forward to the thaw, looking forward to the tulips peeking up from the ground, thinking about what seeds to plant this year. My thumb is not green and has never itched to play in the dirt, but I do long for those signs of spring, usually starting in December!

As we journey through the season of Lent though, we have the opportunity to find that new life amidst the longing. This year, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Baptism almost every week of Lent! Baptisms are one of my favorite moments of worship. Everything from the screaming to the sleeping...they are beautiful! The sacrament of Holy Baptism is all about the dying of our sinful selves and receiving a new life in Christ! Of course, baptisms are important for the one being baptized, but I think they might even be more important for the community gathered. It is so easy to get trapped in the death part of this world, but in the promises of baptism there is new life! When we gather around an individual preparing for baptism we ask them (or their parents) and their sponsors to uphold some promises: coming to church, learning about God's love, teaching them the Creed, Commandments, prayers, and ultimately to be a model of the Christian faith.

Those promises are no small task. Especially for families with young children, coming to church alone is a task, much less being sure to uphold all those other pieces!

But that's where the beauty comes in! Even as the infant is screaming as the water washes over their head, God is present. Even if parents can't get up enough energy or set their priorities straight to get to church regularly, God is present. Even when we get so caught up in ourselves and drop the ball in supporting the baptized...God is present! We can imagine the beauty of what baptism will present for us in the afterlife, but the beauty of it in the present is also breath-taking. God is present with us, regardless of whether we get it right or not!

Items purchased with Memorials funds will not be able to be permanently labeled with the name of the person being remembered.

At Christ Our Savior, memorial remembrances may also be accomplished in a way that provides for support of weekly worship needs. Signup sheets and special envelopes for various needs are found in the fellowship room where coffee and donuts are shared between Sunday services.

Middle School Summer Camp



Potential Work Trip to Pine Ridge Indian Reservation Mid-June

Mid-June, 2015

There are tentative plans for a work trip to Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in mid-June to work on a number of homes that need repair ranging from wheelchair ramps, door replacement, roofing and other weather-proofing work.

Cost will be approximately \$500 per person which includes lodging, food while on site, building supplies, and materials. Transportation



costs will be pooled among travelers.

You don't need excellent construction skills but do need to be able to follow directions and leadership of site supervisors. Participants would also bring their own tools.

Because Pine Ridge Indian Reservation is a unique setting with extremely different cultural norms and mores than we experience here, participants are asked to attend some preparatory training to learn about the history of the Lakota Sioux, conditions on the reservation today and what to expect.
