## From the Pastor

### *New Life From the Old*

This year I have been touched by the death of my Dad, and I write this, the day we had to put down our older dog, Libby. Both events touch me with sadness and feelings of loss, but of course, the feelings while similar are different.

Both events have taken me deeper into faith. As my dad approached the end of his life, he made his own choices and decisions. Among the comfort he gave us, was when he said, "I know God has me. I'm ready to be with your mom." His faith connected with mine. We both knew he was in God's hands. His preparation for the end of life drove me to prayer; to pray that he would have a safe and speedy release, to die with dignity and the comfort of God's promise.

When Libby approached the end of her life, we had to interpret what she was telling us, because animals are not blessed with the gift of speech. She could not tell us directly it was time for her life to end, but all the signs indicated it. No more tail wagging, difficulty walking, breathing, sitting, and getting up. The signs of the end of her life also drove me to prayer. That prayer was different. My prayer was, "God, give me enough love to give her back to you. Thank you for sharing Libby with us for 14 years. We thank you for her gift of teaching us loyalty, devotion, and an unashamed expression of joy. We give her back to you to hold for us."

Prayer did not remove the tears. We just need to cry. It's why God gave us tear ducts. Crying is part of grief and loss. But, because of God's promise, we have more than tears. We have a promise. A promise of new life and recreation.

As we walk in this season of Lent, we look toward the ultimate victory of God's promise in life over death. It's a promise that leads us to feel and understand that there is more than what we can see. There is a promise for new life.

During Lent, we focus on confession and repentance; acts of love, self denial, and generosity toward others. As we do this, we get to participate in our redemption. God doesn't simply do these things TO us in Christ. Jesus invites us to walk with him, to participate in and practice new life now, today, while we are still living.

We face all kinds of losses in life in addition to actual deaths. Each one will touch us in different ways. When they do, let them drive you to prayer. Let them open you up to God's promise, God's grace, and feel new life touch you. I like to say, for every kind of death we face in life, God has

new life waiting for us. If we will just let go of the old things and let God work the miracle of recreation in us.

May this Lent be a journey that takes you into new life, a time to practice living in the way of Christ, and to participate in your redemption from darkness. May God's promise live in you, so that the different kinds of death you face would not be as permanent as they pretend to be.

# Memorials



Memorial financial gifts can be given to honor the memory of a departed loved one, or to celebrate a significant family event such as a birthday, anniversary, graduation, confirmation, or similar milestone. The different ways of how these financial gifts may be used are listed below.

## Memorial Fund

Memorial gifts may be earmarked for immediate application to a specific purpose, such as outreach. Financial gifts not specifying a specific purpose are to be applied to the Christ Our Savior Memorial Fund. This fund is like a saving account intended for congregational needs that would not be possible in the annual general fund budget. A COS lay member of Memorials Team reviews grant requests from COS staff to determine if the request is an appropriate use of savings money. Some examples of approved fund grants in recent years include a new computer system, way-finding signs, and front entrance benches.



A popular designation for Memorials is the support of Christian Youth activity. This is provided by gifts designated for the Sandra Johnson Youth Fund. This

is a special category within the Memorial Fund to provide financial grants to help deserving area youths who otherwise might not be able to attend Service Mission Trips, Lutherdale Summer Camp, or similar Christian youth experiences.

In 2017, the Memorial team authorized scholarships from the Sandra Johnson Memorial Youth Fund to assist youth attendance at Lutherdale Bible Camp and the summer mission trip to South Dakota.

## Memorials For Immediate Use

Memorials given for specific immediate needs, such as outreach or mortgage reduction, are directly deposited into the COS General Fund upon receipt. This money is promptly used for the designated purpose. These gifts are not retained in Memorial Fund investments.

## Other Forms Of Memorial Giving

Purchase of worship needs for a specific Sunday. These include such needs as altar flowers, or an eternal candle. Signup sheets, and pre-printed giving envelopes, are available for these purposes on the narthex wall near the busy bags. These memorials are supportive of weekly worship, and will be acknowledged in Sunday bulletins.

## How Do I Submit My Memorial Or Celebratory Gift?

Gifts may be placed in the Sunday service offering plate or handed in to the church office. Please submit in an envelope

with a note to identify it as a memorial/celebratory gift, and who is being remembered. Please also indicate if the gift is to be designated for one of the above noted special purposes.

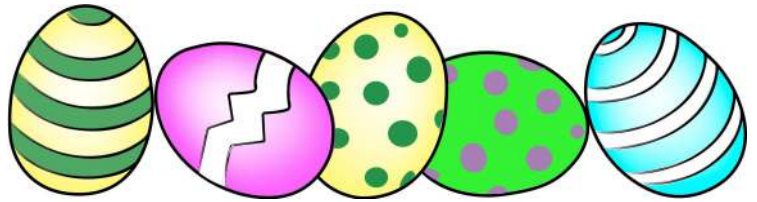
## Easter "Eggs"travaganza Event

If that's the case for you, you are welcome to give more. \$1 a day guarantees two nutritionally complete meals a day for those who receive help through the ELCA hunger appeal and Lutheran World Relief. Both organizations have less than 1% overhead, so every dollar we send goes to direct food aid. Imagine the difference you can make!

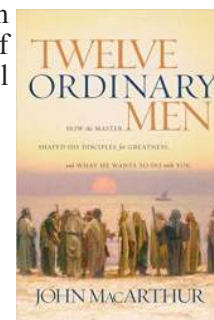


## Women's Inspirational Book Group

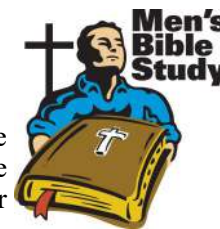
