Romans 5:3-5

And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

With everything that has happened this year 2020 has become shorthand for unimaginably nonsensical, awful, uncontrollable things. Whenever weird, bad things happen, I have heard people say, well, 2020. Many of us have been impacted by COVID fatigue and weariness from all the other drama and stress that has visited us this year. The effects of all this might have been magnified by our isolation.

We have been living in a time when Paul's words ring all the more true; suffering leads us to endurance which leads us to character which leads to hope. This is not merely our hope or hoping the vaccine will come soon and eradicate the pandemic. It is God's hope that always sees a bigger picture; not just next week or next year, not just our current concern or dream, but all of life, all of time.

We can't control things around us but we CAN control how we live in the midst of it all. People are always shaped by crises. We have faced a few. However we have a lot more control over how we will be shaped than we might know as we emerge from this thing. If we do not make intentional choices and decisions to live in God's image then it is easy for our base, selfish nature to become dominant. We may not be proud of it but we all carry that part in us. But that is not all of who we are. In our tradition we hark back to Martin Luther who says we are simultaneously saints and sinners; both at the same time, both living in us. The Cherokee tell a wisdom tale about two wolves that live in us; one is evil, one is good, one will destroy you, one will protect you. Which one wins? The answer is, the one you feed. Which one are you going to feed?

We get to choose. And the good news is we're not on our own. God walks with us in this journey. God does not cause or stop bad things from happening any more than parents can

protect their children from every skinned knee or accident. But like good parents God stays with us and holds us in the hard times just as parents comfort their children when they hurt – even when they are grown.

In a time that has felt like we are powerless over so many things, there are some things we have power over. We get to choose which wolf to feed, how we will live. If 2020 was a year of frustration, loss and fear, what will 2021 be like? This leads me to wonder whether 2021 might be a year for healing and reconciliation.

We are God's children. We are Christians, a name that delightfully means "little Christ's". God comforts us in our sorrows and hardship, and we get to comfort others in theirs. But that doesn't always just happen. It is a choice. We get to choose to bring healing or to languish in pain.

May 2021 be a year of healing, proclaiming and embodying hope and mercy, proclaiming and bringing peace. May we carry the light of Christ into this world as it waits for hope.


Winter/Spring Virtual Lector Sign-Up- Now Available!

Happy New Year Everyone! We are so happy at TACOS to be turning the corner into 2021, and we can't wait to see what this year holds!







Status of Church During COVID

Thanks be to God, there are effective vaccines becoming available for the dreaded COVID-19 virus that has so severely impacted our nation. The caution from epidemiologists is this does not mean the crisis is over. We are also being warned about a “dark winter” with anticipated spikes in the infection and death rates from COVID-19. Their guidance is for us to continue to take precautions of wearing masks, isolating, avoiding any indoor public gatherings and of course, to get the vaccine when it is available to you. Current estimates indicate the vaccine will be available to most people by mid-year 2021. There is a light. We can see it, but it is still far off even though it is getting closer.



For now, we wait, but we wait also knowing an end is in sight. What a relief! But we are not there yet. We are hopeful that we will be able to re-open for public worship sooner than later. When that time comes, it will most likely be in small increments. As epidemiologists put it, its more like using a dimmer switch than flipping a light switch.

While we wait, we continue our mission and purpose; caring for the least, the lost, and the last, providing alternate opportunities for worship and learning online, and living into different expressions of what it means to live our faith.

As we look to the future, we hope to perpetuate what has worked best from the past AND continue what we have learned works well in this time of separation. Our church council and church staff are focused on being prepared for the day when we will be able to gather again. In the meantime, pray for our nation, pray for your neighbors, and pray for your church.
