Last Words from Pastor Tom

It feels odd to be writing my last newsletter article after 37 years of ministry, 32 of them with you. I am full of mixed emotions; sad about leaving what I have known for so long. As we sang our first hymn on Easter, tears ran down my face. But I am also excited about the next chapter of my life which will include a lot of time with Ruth, our daughters and grandchildren, boats, dogs, the garden, and all my other favorite places.

Part of me feels like I just moved in and unpacked my books and boxes. When I moved in, I had a manual typewriter, the church had one phone line and a mimeograph machine. The changes since then help me realize it has been a long time. 32 years. Our daughters grew up here, I grew old here, we have shared the better part of our lives with each other.

As you can imagine, it was NOT my dream to retire under the conditions we have endured for over the last year, but I remain grateful for the ways we have been able to connect and be with each other.

I feel blessed and privileged to have shared the journey of over half of my life with you. I remember the day I came to interview with the call committee, and later the congregation, meeting a church that was excited about their future and looking for what God would be doing among them next. I could not wait to get started.

I am proud of you and always proud to let people know I'm a pastor at your church. People frequently tell me, "Oh, I've heard about that church". Over the years together we have shared struggles and joys, growth in mission, learning, worship, and outreach. You show that the church is not a place we just go to. The church is also where we are sent from into our daily lives and into the whole world. If there is any kind of legacy I leave, I hope it is not about me or a building. I hope it is about God; continually asking how to be faithful to God's call to us in our time, how to adapt to the changes that always come, and to explore what God is doing in this place today.

One of the things that happens when pastors leave or retire from a congregation is they need to completely leave, meaning we end all pastoral ties and functions in the congregation. This means I will no longer participate in any pastoral role or have any presence at Christ Our Savior. This can feel difficult for some of you and for me, because for so many of us our connections have been personal and relational. I raise this up here to let you know that ending pastoral relationships with people at Christ Our Savior is NOT a personal slight or intended to be hurtful. Instead, it is to make room for you to grow into relationship with your new pastor.

Right now, I don't know what it will be like to not be with you. That's OK. We'll all figure it out with God's guidance. Retirement will not only be the end of a career or a job; it is the end of relationships, habits and rhythms. As much as I will miss you and all the ways we have shared our lives, I look forward to what the next chapter of life will be. Pray for me. I hold you in my prayers.

Thank you for a rewarding ministry.



There is a great deal of ambiguity for what the future holds, for how things will settle out; I believe that God is calling us into the uncertainty, to boldly advocate for a new normal that is even more inclusive, welcoming, and attentive to the needs of the most vulnerable.

When Will Our Church Re-Open

We are anxious to re-open for limited public worship but the trends of new COVID-19 cases continues to keep our area in the Very High Risk category.

During the pandemic period we have been guided by recommendations from CDC and the Wisconsin Council of Churches. They urge avoiding re-opening for indoor worship until the rate of new COVID-19 cases is at 10/100,000 or lower for Waukesha County. As of this writing, the trends are moving toward the safer area but are not there yet. *We have a team that's tracking these trends on a weekly basis.* You can track it yourself if you like at <https://globalepidemics.org/key-metrics-for-covid-suppression/>



We hope we will be able to re-open for limited indoor worship by June if the trends support it. *When that happens* our plan at this point is to hold limited in person Sanctuary Worship at 8:30 and Outdoor worship at 10:00 AM every Sunday until the trend becomes safer to gather in person.



Tuesday, May 18th


