### Grounded On Christ

“Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock.” – Matthew 7:24-25

It still feels so odd that in the past year, we had to tell folks, “Please do not come to church.” During this strange season of physical distancing, we have sought to keep Christ’s call as the guiding principle for our practices around worship. Because of our Lord’s command to care for the most vulnerable, we shifted to exclusively online worship. Only after the vaccines were developed and gained some traction in the community did we then add in outdoor worship for Holy Week this year. Likewise, in May, we began worshipping once again in our Sanctuary.

Now as summer rolls on into July, we will be shifting our practices once again, resuming our 6:00 p.m. evening worship in an outdoor format, and bringing our 10:00 a.m. services into the Sanctuary (These changes will take place beginning on July 11<sup>th</sup>). Our hope is that between online, indoor, and outdoor worship options, that everyone will feel like they are welcomed into the worship life at our congregation.

Part of the challenge surrounding our decisions of best worship practices has been the number of moving targets that require our flexibility. Though our scientific community has increased in knowledge and understanding, though new knowledge has shifted practices and expectations for communities wanting to gather, in all the change Christ’s gospel is unchanging.

We rest in the promise of God’s love for humankind; yesterday, today, and forever. Because God loves us, we are freed to live on behalf of others, caring for their needs, rather than fixating on ensuring our own saving. As freed and redeemed people, we are called into God’s divine community of mutual-ity and compassion.

The gift of adoption into God’s family and the task of inviting others to join in sharing the Divine Creator’s abundance is our foundation as Christians. Being the Church together means working out what that gift and task looks like in the world we share. At Christ Our Savior, we have emphasized that the way we love God is through loving other people; loving our Divine Parent by caring for our siblings in the family of God.

We are back in the practice of telling folks, “Come to church, it will be good to see you there,” even as we still recognize that we must still be mindful of the limitations around gathering together. As of the time of writing this article, it is still the case that less than half of our state has completed the Covid vaccinations, and there is no clear timeline for when a vaccine will be approved for use by children under 12 years old. As we find our way forward together, may we continue to bear with one another with grace and may we continue to attend to Christ’s calling to speak and act in ways that care for the most vulnerable. When we act with care for our neighbor’s needs, we join Christ in building up a firm foundation to weather the storms and challenges of this world. May the God who claims and sustains each of us lead and guide us in the coming days.

### Update on the Future of Worship at COS: Changes to occur Sunday, July 11

At our June council meeting, we discussed the results of the poll that we took in the beginning of June. We determined that there are varying degrees of comfort in being inside. We have decided to continue our 8:30 and 10:00 virtual worship services and our 8:30 inside worship service.

Beginning Sunday, July 11, we are going to move our 10:00 worship service inside also. You will not have to sign up for worship any longer. Masks are optional however, to keep our vulnerable populations and those not eligible for the vaccine safe, if you have not been vaccinated, please wear a mask. Initially, we will continue to sit every other row. The staff will switch the rows in between services.

We wanted to make sure we also continued to offer an outdoor worship service. Before COVID-19, we had three worship services two on Sunday mornings and one on Sunday evening. In order to keep our times in sync with where we hope to be in the fall, we decided to hold a 6:00 outdoor worship service. This will also begin Sunday, July 11. This service will look much like it did before. We will have live or recorded music.

We are also working on determining how the use of Fellowship Hall and coffee and donut time will work. This has been such a fluid situation that we will be sure to keep you updated regularly via the COS website, email/constant contact, the newsletter and Sunday bulletins and announcements. Please be sure to pay attention to the council or staff updates as they come out. Thank you for your patience and please pray for us as we continue to make decisions that impact us all.
