Good Tidings in Times of Transition

There are obvious technical aspects to the time when a congregation is in transition: tasks must be completed that facilitate congregational discernment about its identity, its pastoral leadership needs, and its imagined future. Of course, careful and committed engagement with the process toward these ends is good and necessary work as it can allow the congregation the feeling of being grounded rather than being cast about by the winds of change. While this work is useful in managing an institution it also might lead us into other truths that we value as people of faith.

We name ourselves Christians and consent to a life of trusting God which is a different way of living in the world. Implicit and explicit in this way of life is the admission that we are not in control. God is. And the primary way we describe this lived experience of faith is with the terms, "dying and rising." Our faith is not just trusting that "there is a God," it is trusting that when our best laid plans for everything even-



best laid plans for everything eventually fall apart, we are never in jeopardy of being beyond God's capacity to make a new way out of what appears useless in our eyes. Dying and rising. A congregation is not a group of people in love with its own image and gathered around its own strength. A congregation is a group of people gathered around the resurrected Christ whose dying and rising is the source of its trust and its hope who are in turn invited to be the living expression of that trust and hope in the world. While sometimes bothersome, transitions can be necessary reminders of our most cherished truths and true sources of our identity: Jesus Christ is Lord.

These are the words that have framed our understanding of what it means to be the faith community of Christ Our Savior. In this time of ministry exploration, we are given the gift to reflect on who we have been in the past, who we are at in this present moment, and how we feel the Spirit of God calling us into the future, leading us to the work of the gospel in this context.

I was chatting about this time of transition for our congregation with one of my mentors in faith (my mom), and she re-

minded me of a pearl of wisdom she has gained during her years of being in the church. "It is often the case," she said, "that we spend a great deal of time and energy in the church making plans for the future and then asking God to bless those plans. When what's really needed is for us to pay attention to what plans God has for us and then to do that." Friends, I know that we have been in this wilderness season of disruption for well past what we have wanted to endure. I hear lots of folks giving their focus towards how we get back to what was normal a handful of years ago. While it is understandable that we would want to return to what is familiar, I invite us to give space and reflection to what is driving our energy. There is nothing wrong with desiring more people to find value in what you have found valuable, or in enjoying the experience of a full sanctuary praising God. But let us keep foremost in our mind the reasons we hold for why God gathers us in this place.

The mission of the church is not the church. God gathers us and feeds us in order that we might be *sent to serve*. We know the vital role that service to the needs of others plays in making us a church rather than a religious flavored country club. In this time where much is uncertain, and the future is unknown, let us step forward together with the confidence that comes from grounding ourselves in the promise of God's presence. We might not know what the coming months and years will hold for the congregation of Christ Our Savior, but I'm confident if we keep our focus on Jesus and following him that we will be in good company. Let us go together, dear people, and see what God has in store.

Call Process Update

As many of you know, a congregation's call process utilizes two significant features: 1) the formation of a Mission Exploration Team (MET for short) that leads the congregation in the self-study and learning necessary to generate a real understanding of its current context, needs, and giftedness and 2) the formation of a call committee that makes use of the MET's work to ground its task of screening and interviewing pastoral candidates. The COS church council is currently engaging the formation of its MET. Details on the group and the beginning of its work will be shared as soon as the information is available.

Come join us in March as we begin a new book study, Forgiving What You Can't Forget: Discover



The Three "T"s of Stewardship

The recent announcements about the financial challenges facing our congregation may have left many of you feeling helpless or anxious. You may be asking: "What can I do to help?"

Fortunately, there is MUCH you can do to help. We are the body of Christ. We work miracles in His name. And just like Christ, we have the power to heal ourselves and others. God has already given us all the tools we need to put ourselves back on a sustainable path. All he asks in return are the three "T"s: Our **Time**, our **Talents** and our **Treasure**.

Time

The Bible states that we should give one tenth of our earnings to God. Here at COS, our giving tradition has been "5 and 5". We ask that you give 5% of your income and 5 hours of your time per week.

One of the best ways to reduce anxiety is to take action. There are many ways you can use your time to serve our mission. For example: Collecting and recycling aluminum cans or delivering boxes of food to Cross Lutheran or the SOS food pantry, or serving as a worship assistant by reading, ushering or counting offerings. The SEA Literacy program provides students with English language development, homework assistance, as well as helping them develop social skills.

Many of the families that these organizations help, fled their country urgently in hopes for a better life and came with little to nothing. The homes they are now living in are poorly equipped without many daily household items. We have decided to collect donations to be given to these families.

Designated Gift to Youth Position

Meeting the needs of COS's financial challenge has required the church council to carefully consider all possible options. The degree of action needed has required the unwelcome decision that effective March 1, 2022 the positions of Associate Pastor, Director of Youth Education and Ministry, Director of Outreach and Adult Discipleship, and Office Manager will be reduced to half time.

Since this information was first shared, a member of the congregation has stepped forward and pledged funding to raise the Director of Youth and Education position to 75% for a period of 12 months beginning in March. The church council has accepted this generous gift and is grateful for the financial support of the congregation and its members that allows the mission of the church - Gathered in Christ, Fed by God's Word, and Sent to Serve - to occur even in these stressful times.
