Good Tidings in Times of Transition

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again. These sentences are typically spoken as part of the eucharistic prayer in the communion liturgy as a way of drawing those hearing the declaration that they as the body of Christ are now an expression of that very same mystery. There's a lot to recommend "the mystery of faith" as a sacred phrase for congregations finding their way through transition time, but maybe the most significant reason to recommend it is because of how it allows an understanding of vulnerability as a virtue in the faithful life.

"The cross" depicts God at God's most vulnerable. It is the scene by which we come to understand that not even death is able to disrupt God's love for God's people. In the death of Christ, God becomes something unsightly in order to turn it into the ultimate demonstration of God's capacity to grant new life. God's vulnerability is God's willingness to do a very human thing: die. Vulnerability is the pathway by which we have access to new realities that we have scarcely imagined. Going through pastoral transition in church life is a very vulnerable time, but this time can be a gift rather than a chore. In being open to the transition experience, what might arise that's not been previously dreamed of as being important in the life of COS or as a way forward in mission for the sake of God in the community of Sussex?

God bless you all in your work, your prayer, your worship, and in your discernment. A COS sized mission exists in this world – how do you hear God calling you forward to live into it?

<u>From the Pastor</u>...

It's April, which means two things: 1) that we are coming to the close of our Lenten journey and approaching Holy Week; and 2) that our Mission Exploration Team is starting their work of being in conversation with the congregation to understand who we have been as a community, who we are currently, and where we feel God leading us in the work of the gospel. Given the approach of our remembrance of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection and also our community's efforts to identify the mission God has before us, I think it is important to recall that the gospel of Jesus Christ has always had people who have opposed its unfolding.

Said another way, there have always been people who would prefer to prioritize their own pride, comfort, or fear, rather than align their hearts and actions with God's ways of compassionate care of neighbor and solidarity with the most vulnerable. As Lutherans, we acknowledge that this is true for every person to some degree or another – each of us both saint and sinner. And yet, as our gospel accounts remind us, there are some folks in this world who are so determined to get their way rather than God's way that they are willing for others to die if it means keeping the status quo as it is.

As Christians, Jesus bids us to take up our crosses – those symbols of rebellion against the ways of the Empire – and follow him. Jesus invites us to live as members of the kingdom of God, bringing transformation to our own lives, as well as the communities we live in. In the time that I have journeyed together with all of you, I have seen how our congregation feels the calling of the gospel to respond to the needs of hungry neighbors, through supporting our local Sussex Outreach Services, to packing meals for Worldwide Hunger Relief, and through serving meals with a variety of local ministries.

While I imagine that feeding hungry people will continue to be a defining trait of our common call to the ministry of Jesus' gospel, I'm watching with anticipation to see what additional urging the Holy Spirit has ignited in our congregation. How might God be stirring us to be a continued source of transformation in the world – both through caring for the needs of others caused by the brokenness of our world, but also in ways that would work to repair the brokenness and create a fuller expression of the communities of mutual solidarity and care?

While changing the world can feel like a huge task, such is the calling that God puts before us. There's a quote by Ursula K Le Guin where she names that there was a time when the divine right of kings seemed inescapable – until it wasn't. God is calling us to proclaim in faith that our Creator has indeed made a world where all people can experience the abundant fullness of life. Dear people, I look forward to discerning together our shared sense of call for how God is unfolding this work of restoration through us.
