Good Tidings in Times of Transition

Stories of call abound throughout scripture. Creation (cf. Genesis 1 - 2:3). Moses (cf. Exodus 3 - 4:1-17). Jonah (cf. Jonah 1:1 -3). Samuel (1 Samuel 3). Saul/ Paul (Acts 9:1-19). We might even consider the Annunciation (the angel Gabriel's announcement to Mary that she would bear the son of God) a call story (cf. Luke 1:26-38, 46-55). These are always stories of people's discernment to follow through with living a life previously unimagined, yet somehow unavoidable, out of the unshakable sense that not only is this what God is inviting them to, but perhaps even that God will not relieve them of their burden to act. Call stories aren't just the providence of bible stories, they are real for us as well. One of the most important yet challenging questions for a congregation in transition is: what do you hear God calling you to? So, church? What future do you imagine God calling you forward into? Beyond the calling of a new pastor, what stirs in your heart and in your imagination about how God might be calling Christ Our Savior to be a signpost for the gospel? What are your hopes and dreams for serving your community? As the church, our sense of call likely won't materialize out of thin air, but in engagement with the biblical witness and through prayer, we might discover that the path forward is discernible in the tension we experience around our felt limitations and how we collectively hear the gospel.

I hope that you feel empowered and emboldened to share with the Mission Exploration Team the ways that you have experienced God at work in this community, and your hopes for how God may be preparing us to continue the work of the gospel in the years to come. Our community is made better for our different experiences and cultivated wisdom shaping our path as we faithfully seek to follow the Holy Spirit's leading. I look forward to seeing together what God has in store for Christ Our Savior.

Dear COS and TACOS Families,

As most of you already know, last fall I started my journey in seminary towards the hope of one day becoming a pastor in the ELCA. In seminary, students are asked to do many things to strengthen their ministry and leadership skills, as well as continue to discern their sense of call. For me, one of these journeys is Clinical Pastoral Education, or CPE for short.

CPE is the hands-on experience of providing spiritual care to patients, families, and staff members in a multi-faith clinical setting. These units, as they are called, are typically 10-11 weeks of intensive full-time work in a clinical setting like a hospital or care facility.

So as part of my seminary education, starting at the end of May, I will begin my unit of CPE, which I am completing at Village at Manor Park in West Allis, an assisted living care facility. This new chapter in my journey of seminary also means that I will be ending my chapter with you all and the TACOS Ministry.

On May 25, 2022, I will be resigning from my post as the Director of TACOS.

Ministering with and alongside the youth of this community for the past three years has been one of my greatest joys in life. Even through the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, we grew this great ministry into something that is deeply rooted within a wonderful group of young folks that have been equipped to live lives of wholeness and resiliency.

I would like to thank the congregation of Christ Our Savior and the TACOS community for inviting me into your lives the past three years. You entrusted me, a young, inexperienced kid fresh out of undergrad with a new project filled with wonder and possibilities, and I am so thankful you gave me a chance to grow in my leadership and ministry skills in my call towards pastoral ministry. I will cherish the Wednesday afternoons of middle school banter and the countless service projects we participated in for many years to come. Truly, thank you so much.

I would also like to share that my departure does not mean that it is the end of the TACOS Ministry. TACOS will remain on its normal schedule for the remainder of the school year with summer programming as Kim Lewin, the Director of Education and Youth Ministry at COS, will be taking over leadership. Also, I have met with both Kim and Pastor Michael Anderson, interim pastor at COS, and discussed the iterations of what TACOS will look like in the future. Your hardworking staff at COS and the surrounding community support of Sussex will make sure to keep this program going strong for the future, so be sure to keep in touch with your youth leaders for what is to come for TACOS!

I am looking forward to making my last remaining weeks in this role some of the best ones yet! I hope and pray that you all have enjoyed my company as much as I have enjoyed yours.


