Call Process & Update

A congregation's Call Process contains several "mile markers" by which the journey is charted:

A pastor announces that they are leaving the congregation.

An interim pastor is identified, merges with congregational life, and begins to develop a sense of the congregation and a familiarity with the parishioners.

COS is in this stage -----> A Mission Exploration Team (MET) is formed and works to engage the congregation in the self-learning and investigation that reveals a thorough understanding of the congregation's history and journey, the present reality of the congregation, where the congregation believes God is calling them, and what kind of pastoral leadership might best partner with them in pursuing that mission.

This is the meat and potatoes of the Call Process.

A Call Committee is formed and utilizes the work of the MET for assessing pastoral candidates in interviews.

The Church Council receives the Call Committee's pastoral candidate recommendation...

...and at long last...The congregation votes on the Church Council's recommended pastoral candidate and a call is issued.



The MET has been formed and is meeting approximately every other week. COS's MET is toiling on the components of the Call Process that engage the congregation on its awareness of "Who We Are" and what that means for clarifying congregational mission and calling a new pastor. It is in the throes of planning the first congregation-wide mission exploration event - a Congregational History/ Timeline Event held on July 31 to chart and document the trajectory of congregational life. What aspects of church life are you grateful for? What are the high-lights of your community participation? What ministries have allowed you to express your faith in ways that you perhaps found surprising? Does who we say we are align with the reality of who we are?

Good Tidings in Times of Transition

Isaiah 43:18-19

¹⁸Do not remember the former things,
or consider the things of old.

¹⁹I am about to do a new thing;
now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?
I will make a way in the wilderness
and rivers in the desert.



Scripture presents the story – generation after generation – of God doing a new thing in the lives of God's people. This work is vividly expressed in every corner of scripture, both in the old and new testaments. The "new thing" God is doing might look like an ark, a burning bush, a shepherd with a slingshot, or – as in the case of the text above – the blistering voice of a prophet. It might look like Ruth, or Queen Esther, or Elizabeth, or Mary, or Jesus, or an Ethiopian eunuch. God is always doing a new thing – do you perceive it? How do you perceive the new thing that God is doing? How do you perceive the new thing of God that is arising among you for the sake of God's glory, the love of Christ, the proclamation of the gospel, and the flow of God's justice and love to all creation?

To perceive the new thing God is doing, you must cultivate new ways to see. To see a new thing, you can't look to a memory, you must look to the present. You need to look within yourselves and at the world around you and your neighbors. To see what God is up to in your lives, you must explore the interior margins of your own lives and the ways in which you feel stretched, uncomfortable, and called into territory that might be unfamiliar. It is in that tense space that God invites you to exert your giftedness and encounter the hidden blessing that resides there. To see what God is up to in your community and in the lives of your neighbors, look to margins of the community, community groups, and neighbors. Who is present? Who is not present? How do we understand who is represented and who is not represented? What does that awareness mean? How does it speak to you? How does Christ Our Savior's sense of community giftedness and mission intersect with the world around it? God is at work on the margins and these are places that will surprise you with whom you'll encounter that invite you into new versions of yourselves.

The invitation to witness and attend to the new thing that God is doing is the heart of a congregational Call Process. While for all the world it has the appearance of being a time of action, it is in truth a time of re-learning how to listen for God's voice and watch for God's presence. As Christ Our Savior's Call Process continues, may you see and bear witness to God's presence among you and the new thing emerging in your midst.

Fellowship With Others



It is in fellowship with others that we are united to bring transformation to our world through the power of God working with us.

I know that the busyness of life makes many demands of our time and energy, and I hope that even through this season of transition we continue to foster a culture at Christ Our Savior of having grace for one another's needs. There is much of us being the church that takes place outside of our building, after all. But I encourage you to seek out whatever that next step is towards grounding yourself in the community we create in our congregation. As the saying goes, we will reap what we sow. May the Lord of the harvest bless each of us with the bountiful joy and grace that comes from sharing in Christ's gospel movement.


Sunday School Registration



In the apostle Paul's letters to the burgeoning Christian churches of his day, he often began them with words that celebrated those church's participation in the work of the gospel. It's a feature of writing not much seen in our times but was common in the first century – vociferously celebrating one's co-workers. A particularly memorable example of this is found in Philippians. Paul writes, "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ." What is Paul saying? That God completes in us the things that God begins in us; that who we are and what we are naturally gifted for to share with the world as a sign of God's love will be whole and complete; that God sticks with us and never abandons us. It's a powerful thanksgiving that calls out the value that people have and God's persistence in caring for those God has made.

In our work for the gospel in the church we celebrate the value of those partners in ministry whose giftedness is a blessing to all who encounter it. We celebrate Director of Education and Youth Ministry Kim Lewin, who submitted her resignation on July 18 and whose final day at COS will be Sunday, August 14.
