Call Process & Update

A congregation's Call Process contains several "mile markers" by which the journey is charted:

- A pastor announces that they are leaving the congregation.
- An interim pastor is identified, merges with congregational life, and begins to develop a sense of the congregation and a familiarity with the parishioners.
- COS is in this stage -----> A Mission Exploration Team (MET) is formed and works to engage the congregation in the self-learning and investigation that reveals a thorough understanding of the congregation's history and journey, the present reality of the congregation, where the congregation believes God is calling them, and what kind of pastoral leadership might best partner with them in pursuing that mission. This is the meat and potatoes of the Call Process.

· A Call Committee is formed and utilizes the work of the MET for assessing pastoral candidates in interviews.



- The Church Council receives the Call Committee's pastoral candidate recommendation...
- ...and at long last...The congregation votes on the Church Council's recommended pastoral candidate and a call is issued.

Good Tidings in Times of Transition

A significant part of the mission of the church is to stay connected. Staying connected to the source of our faith allows us to remain connected as a community of faith. Staying connected as faith community rooted in the source of our faith allows us to recognize the ways in which even that connection is incomplete if it is divorced from the surrounding community and its concerns. Our life in faith is inter-related and intertwined with the world around us and Christ's invitation for us to share in God's emerging kingdom among us invites us to examine the intersections of our lives with the world around us. This is our gospel work, our kingdom work, and there is no end to it – only new generations of living into God's mission to love and bless the world. But everything begins with remaining connected to our

source of life:

John 15:1-5

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing.

In this time of transition, how is your connection to your source of sustenance in the Christian faith? Lives of faith contain many seasons of change – high points and low points or times of connection with greater or lesser intensity. What faith practices do you embrace of seasons of change that keep you connected to the vine that gives you life? Prayer? Worship? Daily devotion reading? Walking in nature? Staying connected to the source of our vitality need not involve Samson-esque displays of will and strength. More often than not, maintaining connection begins with the admission that we are in need of connection and then allowing that authentic desire to emerge through the humble prayers, "Help me," and "Thank you."

Christ is the vine and you are the branches. May God bless you richly as you are reminded of the joys of belonging to God and flourishing in Christ's care.

From Pastor Joe

Grace and peace to you from our Savior Jesus Christ. Wellness and wholeness are found in dealing with the world as it is, rather than as we wish it were. This has become something of a meditation I have found myself returning to again and again over the past couple years. For all that we might wish our lives or our world were different, we are better served in engaging challenging truth than retreating to comfortable falsehood.

It is true that we are a different faith community now than we were three, or five, or ten years ago.

It is true that we are staffed differently than we were at this time last year and that we are operating with fewer total hours of paid staff labor each week.

It is true that we have no guarantees that we are on a trajectory to a status quo that more closely mirrors what Christ Our Savior was like pre-pandemic.

And yet, it is still most certainly true that God is at work in our community. It is still most certainly true that the movement of the gospel is unfolding in our midst with the promise of transformation, new life, and hope. And it is still most certainly true that God is calling us into a fuller embodiment of Christ's goodness and grace for this world in need.

As we work through this process of Mission Exploration for the purpose of preparing to call a new Senior Pastor, we cannot understate the value of this time of reflection – not just for the call process – but also for refreshing our attention to the needs of our community and the ways that God is seeking to work through us to care for those needs. Our faith in Christ calls us to attend to the brokenness of the world. It is when we care for others in tangible ways that we share in witnessing God's faithful presence among us.

May you experience this autumn, the harsh beauty of the world as it is, and may the Spirit of God fill and sustain you in the work of this gospel movement we share.

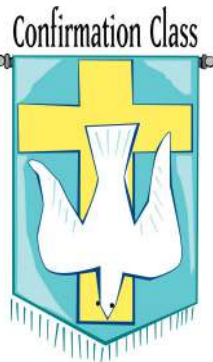
Sunday School

Coats & Snowpants & Boots Needed

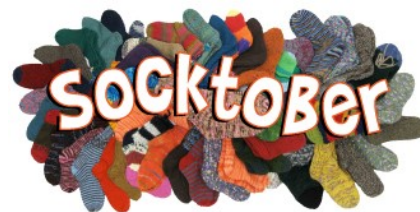
Deadline October 9th
