Call Process & Update

A congregation's Call Process contains several "mile markers" by which the journey is charted:

- A pastor announces that they are leaving the congregation.
- An interim pastor is identified, merges with congregational life, and begins to develop a sense of the congregation and a familiarity with the parishioners.
- COS is in this stage -----> A Mission Exploration Team (MET) is formed and works to engage the congregation in the self-learning and investigation that reveals a thorough understanding of the congregation's history and journey, the present reality of the congregation, where the congregation believes God is calling them, and what kind of pastoral leadership might best partner with them in pursuing that mission. This is the meat and potatoes of the Call Process.
- Surveys and Focus Groups have been conducted to gather congregational input on perceived needs, values, and mission.
- The MET is nearly finished collecting all needed data for completing COS's ministry site profile. Please stay alert for announcements regarding their work!
- A Call Committee is formed and utilizes the work of the MET for assessing pastoral candidates in interviews.
- The Church Council receives the Call Committee's pastoral candidate recommendation...
- ...and at long last... The congregation votes on the Church Council's recommended pastoral candidate and a call is issued.



Good Tidings in Times of Transition

What spiritual practices do you rely on for support throughout life? Are you someone who prays? If so, do you pray alone, or do you call upon fellow believers to pray with? Are you someone who reads scripture or daily devotions? Perhaps weekly worship is your primary spiritual practice – the touchstone that keeps you grounded regardless of the ups and downs of life. Maybe your practices extend beyond "traditional" church forms of spiritual practice. Regardless of your practice, if you have one, I'm happy that you do. Spiritual practices often feel like "practice," which is to say that they're not always exciting and they most often seem packed with meaning or importance only when our life is in crisis. But, when adhered to over time, these things shape us. They shape who we are, how we think, and not

insignificantly, how we show up in the world – how we live. What's shaping you?

We know from scripture that even Jesus kept spiritual practices. Perhaps we assume this wouldn't be necessary for the Son of God. But despite the complexity of his identity, even Jesus needed grounding practices that kept him connected to God the Father and his own inner self. Such grounded-ness and connection is worth pursuing in cultivating our faith, not to assert our will over and against God's, but rather so that we more and more come to trust that even when our strength or faith falters, that God's care for us never does. Our faith tradition is predicated on God's capacity to astonish the world with new life when all appears darkest. May you know the power of the God of resurrection in your life.

May our God, who has called us together for this season, grant you all that you need to act with boldness for the work of the gospel and may the Holy Spirit sustain you in ways beyond belief.

On Thursday, November 10th, Community Banquet will be held at St. James Catholic Church on Town Line Road in Menomonee Falls. Christ our Savior

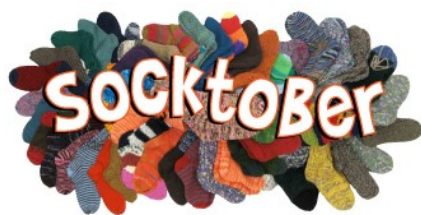
