Call Process & Update

A congregation's Call Process contains several "mile markers" by which the journey is charted:

- A pastor announces that they are leaving the congregation.
- An interim pastor is identified, merges with congregational life, and begins to develop a sense of the congregation and a familiarity with the parishioners.
- A Mission Exploration Team (MET) is formed and works to engage the congregation in the self-learning and investigation that reveals a thorough understanding of the congregation's history and journey, the present reality of the congregation, where the congregation believes God is calling them, and what kind of pastoral leadership might best partner with them in pursuing that mission. This is the meat and potatoes of the Call Process.
 - * Surveys and Focus Groups have been conducted to gather congregational input on perceived needs, values, and mission.
 - * The MET drafted Christ Our Savior's Ministry Site Profile.
 - * A Town Hall Meeting was held for congregational review of the MSP and prepared for the congregational Town Hall Meeting last December
- <u>COS IS IN THIS STAGE</u> > A Call Committee is formed. COS's Call Committee is Aaron Dietz, Edie Schaffner, Angie Lura, Dave Abresch, Mike Singer, and Brynn Haigh (youth rep). *The COS Call Committee has received its orientation and is proceeding with its work. Please hold them in prayer.*
- The Church Council receives the Call Committee's pastoral candidate recommendation.
- The congregation votes on the Church Council's recommended pastoral candidate and a call is issued.

Good Tidings in Times of Transition *1 Corinthians 12:12-18, 27-31*

¹²For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body — Jews or Greeks, slaves or free — and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

¹⁴Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. ¹⁵If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁶And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁷If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? ¹⁸But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. ²⁷Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. ²⁸And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. ²⁹Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? ³⁰Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? ³¹But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way.

Some attributes of being the church are always true. It is always gathered by the Holy Spirit. It is the resurrected body of Christ in the world. It is one body with many members. The unique qualities of those members give to the body and to the church its vital, loving, grace-filled, Christ-referencing, God-oriented image in the world. The church as the body of Christ in the world is a dynamic marvel. The church is the repository of the giftedness of its members...and churches need their members to share their giftedness so that the light of Christ that lives within them might be seen.

During seasons of transition or change, the experience of being a church body can bear similarities to those of our own bodies when they undergo periods of stress. Challenging stimuli might cause us to moderate ourselves to manage some of the discomfort we feel. For a body—for example—that's exercising this can be helpful so that we don't "over-do it" and end up injured and exhausted. For a church body it might make similar choices for similar reasons awaiting the arrival of a new pastor.

The synergy of a church body is stoked by the member's ongoing sharing of their giftedness with each other. While transition times are stressful because they underscore the value of pastors for faith communities and the unique role they hold within them, such seasons remind us that it's not pastors who are the church. The people, the members, are the church body and it is your Spirit-led work in your faith community, in the wider community, and in your respective lives that conveys God's mercy for all people. Remembering this truth is a way that faith communities are re-membered, that is, put back together or even held together (perhaps by God's grace?) in transitional seasons.

As Christ Our Savior awaits the calling of its new pastor, the church body needs its members to lend their dynamic light to its shared work. Particularly with an eye toward Sunday morning worship, the church has fallen into a pattern of relying on the same people stepping up in the same roles week after week. While their gifts are valued, a multiplicity of members surely conspire to create the dynamic body which is Christ Our Savior. This summer would be a wonderful time to join your time and love with Christ Our Savior's worship as an acolyte, usher, reader, communion assistant, or member of the altar guild. 


Fellowship Meal
