Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, amen! It has felt wonderful to be so welcomed among you this last month, thank you. I wanted to share a bit about myself and my family for this month's newsletter to continue this path of getting to know each other.

I've been a Pastor for 15 years now, serving in both Barrett and Fergus Falls, Minnesota, as well as locally in Hartland. I have a pretty wide background before that, from working at an intercity Minneapolis mission serving primarily women and children, to working as a bank teller and Olive Garden server; even a stint at hand soldering PCBs for a company that made machines to build corrugated cardboard. That being said, I heard the call to ministry early while I was still in high school over in Stoughton, Wisconsin, and most of my experiences since then have been building to this moment in time being able to serve God alongside you.

However, I also have a request for the people of Christ Our Savior. During the month of April, I will have a Memories Chest placed in the narthex of the church. I encourage you to write about something from our time together that will be sticking with you – a memory, an "aha!" moment, or some other touchstone from the past six years together. Or, if helpful, feel free to use one or more variations of the prompts I share with our confirmands for sermon notes:

How did you feel most connected to God during our years of ministry together? Share one way that you were encouraged, sustained, or experienced God's grace as part of the community of faith at Christ Our Savior.

How did you hear God's call for you to share love or work for justice in the world? Name a way you felt the urging of the Spirit sending you out as the body of Christ to bring loving transformation to the world.

What is a question or curiosity we explored together that you continue to reflect on?

I would love to take a full Memories Chest with me as a tangible reminder of our shared time together. My current plan as my call to Christ Our Savior resolves is to spend some time attending to the needs of our family and reconnecting with personal practices of Sabbath keeping. It would be a treasure and a blessing as I enter into a fallow season to be able to reflect on these memories and allow them to guide my discernment for where and how the Spirit is leading me.

It is a gift of God's promise of restoration that we never truly say goodbye in the church, only "See you later." I know that our family intends to stay in the Greater Milwaukee area, so we might run into one another at a community gathering or synod event. I look forward to hearing about how God continues to stir up the community of Sussex and the people of Christ Our Savior to embody grace, peace making, compassionate justice, and abundant hospitality for their neighbors.

Until we meet again, know that I hold you in my prayers and that I give thanks to God for you and for our time together.

And thank you to Carol for leading our young people through this class and important milestone.




VBS - Save the Date!
